

TOWN COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

JULY 3, 2020

JACKSON, WYOMING

The Jackson Town Council met in a special session in the Council Chambers of the Town Hall located at 150 East Pearl at 3:00 P.M. Upon roll call the following were found to be present:

TOWN COUNCIL: *In-person*: Mayor Pete Muldoon and Jim Stanford. *via Webex*: Hailey Morton Levinson, Arne Jorgensen, and Jonathan Schechter.

STAFF: Roxanne Robinson, Tyler Sinclair, Lea Colasuonno, Zolo, and Michelle Weber

Mayor Muldoon stated the purpose of this meeting was to consider an emergency ordinance for face coverings. Lea Colasuonno made staff comment. Members of Town Council discussed the ordinance. Public comment was given by John Frechette, Christian Burch, Gloria Courser, and Bob Culver.

A motion was made by Hailey Morton Levinson and seconded by Jim Stanford to read the ordinance by short title. Mayor Muldoon called for the vote. The vote showed all in favor and the motion carried.

EMERGENCY ORDINANCE 1255: AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE REQUIRING THE WEARING OF FACE COVERINGS IN LIMITED PLACES IN THE TOWN OF JACKSON, WITH EXCEPTIONS; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY, PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND A TIME FOR TERMINATION.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF JACKSON, WYOMING, IN REGULAR SESSION DULY ASSEMBLED, THAT:

A motion was made by Hailey Morton Levinson and seconded by Jonathan Schechter to suspend the requirements for three (3) public reading of ordinances under W.S. § 15-1-115(c). Mayor Muldoon called for the vote. The vote showed all in favor and the motion carried.

A motion was made by Hailey Morton Levinson and seconded by Jim Stanford to approve Emergency Ordinance 1255 implementing a Face Covering requirement in limited places within the Town of Jackson for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety or welfare to: a) prevent and slow the potential spread of COVID-19; b) significantly reduce likelihood of overwhelming the strain on the local health care and emergency service systems; and c) declare an emergency, and provide for an effective date and time for termination. Members of Council discussed the ordinance. Mayor Muldoon called for the vote. The vote showed all in favor and the motion carried.

Adjourn. A motion was made by Hailey Morton Levinson and seconded by Jim Stanford to adjourn. The vote showed all in favor and the motion carried. The meeting adjourned at 3:40 p.m. minutes:rdvr
