

TOWN COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

APRIL 15, 2019

JACKSON, WYOMING

The Jackson Town Council met in regular workshop session in the Council Chambers of the Town Hall at 150 East Pearl at 3:08 P.M. Upon roll call the following were found to be present:

MAYOR: Pete Muldoon.

COUNCIL: Jim Stanford, Arne Jorgensen, and Jonathan Schechter. Hailey Morton Levinson was absent.

STAFF: Larry Pardee, Roxanne Robinson, Audrey Cohen-Davis, Lea Colasuonno, Todd Smith, Brian Schilling, Floren Poliseo, Tyler Sinclair, April Norton, Darren Brugmann, Jeff Deal, and Sandy Birdyshaw.

Snow King Bike Path Extension. Brian Schilling made staff comment on the 2018 Snow King Bike Lane and lessons learned from the pilot project and the proposal to extend the bike path to Cache Street for 2019.

Public comment was given by: Bill Schwartz, Molly Breslin, Dave Samuels, Jesse Reilly and Sandra Brewers (made by Dave Samuels), Clint Troxel, Nena Lenz, Darlene Trujillo, Christine Simpson, Matt Leddick, Amberley Baker, Katherine Dowson, and Julie Klomparins.

A motion was made by Jim Stanford and seconded by Arne Jorgensen to approve the extension of the Snow King Avenue protected bike lanes from Millward St. to Cache St. and to direct staff to coordinate with Town of Jackson departments as needed to implement the project. Mayor Muldoon called for the vote. The vote showed 4-0 in favor and the motion carried.

Liquor Code Updates. This item was not heard. A motion was made by Jonathan Schechter and seconded by Arne Jorgensen to continue Liquor Code Updates to the regular meeting tonight after the Consent Calendar. Mayor Muldoon called for the vote. The vote showed 4-0 in favor and the motion carried.

Matters Related to Sagebrush Apartment Project. Floodway Areas. Tyler Sinclair made staff comment. Christine Walker made comment on behalf of the applicant.

A motion was made by Pete Muldoon and seconded by Arne Jorgensen to direct staff to work with the applicant to proceed and submit an application to transfer a 0.23 parcel to the Town subject to final review and approval at the May 6, 2019 regular Town Council meeting. Mayor Muldoon called for the vote. The vote showed 3-1-0 in favor, with Stanford opposed and Morton Levinson absent. The motion carried.

Affordable Housing Deed Restriction. A motion was made by Jonathan Schechter and seconded by Jim Stanford to continue this to May 6, 2019. Mayor Muldoon called for the vote. The vote showed 4-0 in favor and the motion carried.

Adjourn. A motion was made by Jonathan Schechter and seconded Arne Jorgensen to adjourn to executive session to consider matters concerning litigation to which the governing body is a party or proposed litigation to which the governing body may be a party in accordance with Wyoming Statute 16-4-405(a)(iii), and to discuss personnel matters in accordance with Wyoming Statute 16-4-405(a)(ii). The vote showed 4-0 in favor and the motion carried. The meeting adjourned at 5:17 P.M. minutes:spb
