DECEMBER 7, 2020

JACKSON, WYOMING

The Jackson Town Council met in regular session in the Council Chambers of the Town Hall located at 150 East Pearl at 6:01 P.M. Upon roll call the following were found to be present:

- C. **Temporary Sign Permit: Jackson Hole Food & Wine (P20-197).** To approve the temporary banner requested by Jackson Hole Food & Wine subject to three conditions of approval: 1. The use of the site shall be granted by the property owner. 2. The signs shall not be located on the sidewalks or in the public right of way. 3. The sign for Jackson Hole Food & Wine may be installed at 105 Buffalo Way, Albertsons from December 20, 2020 to January 2, 2021.
- D. **Special Event: Winter Wonderland.** To approve the application made by Grand Teton Skating Association for the Winter Wonderland special event, subject to the conditions listed in the staff report and further approve the Memorandum of Understanding subject to approval and any minor changes by the Town Attorney and authorize the Mayor to execute the agreement. In addition, the applicant will abide by all health state and local orders in place during the time of operation.

There was no public comment on the Consent Calendar. Mayor Muldoon called for the vote. The vote showed all in favor and the motion carried.

Special Event: Pedigree Dog Sled Race Ceremonial Start. A motion was made by Hailey Morton Levinson and seconded by Jim Stanford to continue this item to the December 21, 2020 regular meeting. Mayor Muldoon called for the vote. The vote showed all in favor and the motion carried.

Human Services Plan and Resource Allocation. *This item was added to the agenda for the Council to take action on. It had been previously discussed at the December 7, 2020 Joint Information Meeting and the Town continued the item to this meeting.*

A motion was made by Hailey Morton Levinson and seconded by Arne Jorgensen to adopt the Teton County and Town of Jackson Human Services and Resource Allocation Plan and Appendices, and direct staff to move forward with the Implementation Plan as presented today. Mayor Muldoon called for the vote. The vote showed all in favor and the motion carried.

Resort Liquor License Application, CCC's Center Street LLC. Sandy Birdyshaw made staff comment. The Mayor opened a public hearing to hear protest against the issuance of this liquor license. None were made. The Mayor closed the public hearing. Robert Nolan made comment on behalf of the applicant.

Having considered the Wyo. Stat. §12-4-104(b) statutory factors for this application, a motion was made by Hailey Morton Levinson and seconded by Jonathan Schechter to approve the issuance of a resort liquor license to CCC's Center Street LLC dba The Cloudveil for the license year ending March 31, 2021, subject to the following conditions and further direct the Town Clerk to issue the license upon confirmation that the conditions of approval have been met within the timeframe set forth in Wyoming Statute 12-4-103(a)(iv).

1. Prior to liquor license issuance, the applicant shall comply with all Town of Jackson Building Codes, Fire, Health & Safety Codes, and the Land Development Regulations, and will have obtained all required permits and approvals from all applicable Town/County departments.
2. Prior to liquor license issuance, the applicant shall provide a copy of the food service permit for the restaurant.
3. Any additional minor corrections deemed necessary by staff and the Wyoming Liquor Division.

Mayor Muldoon called for the vote. The vote showed all in favor and the motion carried.

Item P20-166: Subdivision Plat at 808 Upper Redmond. A motion was made by Hailey Morton Levinson and seconded by Jim Stanford to continue P20-166 to the January 19, 2021 regular meeting. Mayor Muldoon called for the vote. The vote showed all in favor and the motion carried.

Northern South Park Neighborhood Plan: Steering Committee Selection. Tyler Sinclair and Kristi Malone made staff comment.

A motion was made by Arne Jorgensen and seconded by Jonathan Schechter to recommend to Teton County the following five applicants as Steering Committee members for the Northern South Park neighborhood planning process, Bill Collins, Hans Flinch, Laura Bonich, Larry Thal, and Wendy Martinez. Mayor Muldoon called for the vote. The vote showed all in favor and the motion carried.

The Council held discussion on drafting a narrative to go along with the name recommendations. A motion was made by Arne Jorgensen and seconded by Hailey Morton Levinson to include with the five recommended names the following points that were considered in the selection: 1) reviewing for expertise 2) limiting real or perceived conflicts from either board of staff of organization that would like to be involved with the planning process or the development that may follow 3) representation of the diversity in our community 4) not done from a standpoint of representing different aspects of the community which would be the role of the stakeholder process 5) these five positions should represent a strong support and awareness of the opportunity for public benefit from this process. Jim Stanford congratulated Sandy Birdyshaw on obtaining her Certified Municipal Clerk designation. The Council discussed unfilled positions, revenues, supporting health professionals in the COVID pandemic, the Governor's Order taking effect Wednesday, and the Library Board.
