July 19, 2021

JACKSON, WYOMING

The Jackson Town Council met in a regular session in the Town Hall Council Chambers located at 150 East Pearl in Jackson, at 6:00 P.M. This meeting was held in-person and through the Zoom platform. Upon roll call the following were found to be present:

Vice Mayor Jorgensen called for the vote. The vote showed 3-0 in favor with Morton Levinson and Rooks absent and the motion carried.

**Update Jackson Municipal Code Title 1 General Provision.** Lea Colasuonno and Michelle Weber made staff comment. Council held discussion with staff. A motion was made by Jonathan Schechter and seconded by Arne Jorgensen to direct staff to revise Title 1 of the Jackson Municipal Code to reduce the administrative fee for a person convicted of or receiving a deferred adjudication for public intoxication from \$100 to \$25 with a full update to the Title for technical matters as identified by staff, and to thereafter bring back a full revised draft of Title 1 to Council at a future meeting. Vice Mayor Jorgensen called for the vote. The vote showed 2-1 in favor with Jessica Sell Chambers opposed and the motion carried. A motion was made by Jonathan Schechter and seconded by Jessica Sell Chambers to direct staff to revise Title 1 of the Jackson Municipal Code to add that every Municipal Judge of the Town of Jackson is 1) an active member of the Wyoming State Bar in good standing for at least 5 years prior to appointment and 2) free from any discipline by all state bars from which they hold licensure and state supreme courts for a period of, at minimum, 5 years prior to appointment and 3) successfully complete an employment screening, with a full update to the Title for technical matters as identified by staff, and to thereafter bring back a full revised draft of Title 1 to Council at a future meeting. Vice Mayor Jorgensen called for the vote. The vote showed 3-0 in favor with Morton Levinson and Rooks absent and the motion carried.

**400 W. Snow King Proposal Award.** April Norton made staff comment. Council held discussion with staff. Anna Olson made public comment. A motion was made by Jessica Sell Chambers and seconded by Jonathan Schechter to move to direct staff to work with BlueLine Development and Snow King Partners to develop a draft application that includes a revised site plan for the September 2021 Wyoming Community Development Authority Low-Income Housing Tax Credit program and to present the draft application to the Council for review and approval prior to application submission. Vice Mayor Jorgensen called for the vote. The vote showed 3-0 in favor with Morton Levinson and Rooks absent and the motion carried.

**Item P21-093: TC Report Text Amendment Related to NL-5 Zone to Allow Subdivision of Lots for Deed Restricted Units.** Tyler Valentine and April Norton made staff comment. Council held discussion with staff. Based upon the findings as presented in the staff report and made by the applicant for an amendment to the text of the Land Development Regulations (Item P21-093), a motion was made by Jonathan Schechter and seconded by Jessica Sell Chambers to make findings 1-6 in Section 8.7.1.C of the Land Development Regulations related to 1) Is consistent with the purposes and organization of the LDRs; 2) Improves the consistency of the LDRs with other provisions of the LDRs; 3) Provides flexibility for landowners within standards that clearly define desired character; 4) Is necessary to address changing conditions, public necessity, and/or state or federal legislation; 5) Improves implementation of the Comprehensive Plan; and 6) Is consistent with other adopted Town Ordinances, and to approve the requested text amendments subject to this staff report, the departmental reviews attached hereto and the following condition of approval: 1. If three deed restricted units are developed on a lot or site, the overall project shall get a 600 sf increase in floor area provided all other LDR standards are met. Vice Mayor Jorgensen called for the vote. The vote showed 3-0 in favor with Morton Levinson and Rooks absent and the motion carried.

**Item P21-118: Final Plat 645 S. Cache.** Katelyn Page and Paul Anthony made staff comment. Council held discussion with staff. Sue Karichner made public comment. Based upon the findings as presented in the staff report and as made by the applicant for Item P21-118, a motion was made by Jonathan Schechter and seconded by Jessica Sell Chambers to move to make findings 1-4 as set forth in Section 8.5.3.C (Subdivision Plat) of the Land Development Regulations relating to 1) Conformance with Development Plan or Development Option Plan; 2) Complies with standards of Section 8.5.3. Subdivision Plat; 3) Complies with standards of Division 7.2. Subdivision Standards; 4) Complies with other relevant standards of these LDRs, to approve a Final Plat for the 645 South Cache Condominiums Addition to the Town of Jackson for the property addressed at 645 S. Cache Street subject to the departmental reviews attached hereto and the following conditions of approval:

1. Within thirty (30) calendar days from the date of Town Council approval, the applicant shall satisfactorily address all comments made by the Town of Jackson and other reviewing entities included in the attached Departmental Reviews and submit the corrections to the Planning Department. The Planning Director shall review and approve all required changes prior to recording the plat with the County Clerk. 2. The Special Restrictions for Workforce Ownership Housing shall be recorded immediately following the recordation of Final Plat. 3. The required easement legally connecting access from 645 South Cache to the required parking on 655 S. Cache shall be recorded at the time of recordation of Final Plat. 4. Park and School Exactions shall be paid prior to plat recording. Vice Mayor Jorgensen called for the vote. The vote showed 3-0 in favor with Morton Levinson and Rooks absent and the motion carried.

**Public Hearing: Snow King Chair Project.** Johnny Ziem made staff comment. Vice Mayor Jorgensen opened a public hearing. Anna Olson, Ryan Stanley and Carrie Geraci made public comment. Vice Mayor Jorgensen closed the public hearing. A motion was made by Jonathan Schechter and seconded by Jessica Sell Chambers to approve the submittal of the Wyoming Business Council Community Enhancement grant application to help fund the Summit Connector Chair Placemaking Project and authorize the Mayor and/or the Town Administrator to execute any required grant documents on behalf of this project. Vice Mayor Jorgensen called for the vote. The vote showed 3-0 in favor with Morton Levinson and Rooks absent and the motion carried.

##### **A RESOLUTION PROVIDING APPROVAL FOR A GRANT FOR RECONSTRUCT RUNWAY 1/19 (PHASE III) AIP GRANT NO. 3-56-0014-067-2021**

WHEREAS, the Jackson Hole Airport Board (the "Board") was organized as an airport board on January 17, 1968 pursuant to Wyoming Statute §10-5-202; is deemed a joint power board pursuant to Wyoming Statute §16-1-105; and is the owner and operator of a public use airport known as the Jackson Hole Airport ("Airport"); and

WHEREAS, as such the Board is authorized to receive grants from the Federal Aviation Administration ("FAA") for planning and/or improvements to the Airport; and

WHEREAS, the Board has received a grant offer from FAA to "Reconstruct Runway 1/19 (Phase III)" at the Airport in the maximum amount of \$9,996,778, and the Board desires to accept such grant; and

WHEREAS, the FAA requires a resolution of approval from the Town of Jackson, as co-sponsor, in order for the Airport to receive such a grant.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Town Council of the Town of Jackson, Wyoming that it hereby provides approval for the Board to accept FAA AIP Grant Number 3-56-0014-067-2021 in the amount of \$9,996,778 for the purpose of "Reconstruct Runway 1/19 (Phase III)," as more fully described in the Project Application.

This Resolution shall become effective upon adoption.

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the Town of Jackson desires to participate in the Business Ready Community Grant and Loan Program to assist in financing this project; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the Town of Jackson recognizes the need for the Summit Connector Chair Placemaking Project and believes this project will address those needs; and

WHEREAS, the public benefits of this project will be economic development, beautification of public space, generation of creative placemaking through history and art, visual connection from Town Square to Snow King Mountain, increased vitality in the downtown core and the

consideration is measured by the successful installation of rehabilitated Snow King summit chairs installed for use by pedestrians accompanied by historical interpretive features; and  
WHEREAS, the specific goals and measures of success of this project are increased walkability in downtown Jackson, visual connectivity between downtown Jackson and Snow King Mountain, and preservation of Snow King Mountain Resort heritage; and

WHEREAS, the Business Ready Community Grant and Loan Program requires that certain criteria be met, as described in the Wyoming Business Council's Rules governing the program, and to the best of our knowledge this application meets those criteria; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the Town of Jackson plans to provide cash match to this Business Ready Community Grant and Loan Program Enhancement project from the following source(s):

1.Town of Jackson Public Art Funds: \$5,000

2.Snow King Mountain donated lift chairs: \$22,500; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the Town of Jackson plans to provide staff time as an in-kind match to this Business Ready Community Grant and Loan Program Enhancement project from the following source(s):

1.Public Works: for the purpose of design and construction management,\$2,500

2.Planning: for the purpose of design and location placement, \$1,200

3.Parks and Recreation: for the purpose of design and location placement,\$2,200; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body for the Town of Jackson has a comprehensive operation and maintenance plan including projected expenses and project income sources extending the life of the asset(s); and

WHEREAS, In the event of any project cost overruns, the Town of Jackson will provide funding in the amount necessary to complete the project utilizing Town of Jackson Public Art Funds; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body for the Town of Jackson is considering other possible funding solutions for this project which include local business sponsors, private donations, and Wyoming Humanities Council grant funding; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Jackson is working in partnership with the Chamber of Commerce, Jackson Hole Public Art, Snow King Mountain Resort, and private business entities; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Jackson held a public hearing on July 19, 2021, to solicit testimony from citizens, and gave full consideration to all comments received; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE Town of Jackson, that a grant application in the amount of \$100,000 be submitted to the Wyoming Business Council for consideration of assistance in funding the Summit Connector Chair Placemaking Project.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Jackson Hole Public Art and the Chamber of Commerce are hereby designated as the authorized representatives of the Town of Jackson to act on behalf of the Governing Body on all matters relating to this grant application.
