NOVEMBER 21, 2022

JACKSON, WYOMING

The Jackson Town Council met in regular session in the Town Hall Council Chambers located at 150 East Pearl in Jackson, at 6:00 P.M. This meeting was held in-person and through the Zoom platform. Upon roll call the following were found to be present:

Restaurant Liquor License – Root Café LLC. Mayor Morton Levinson opened the public hearing. Lynsey Lenamond made staff comment. Council held discussion with staff. There was no public comment. Having considered Wyoming Statute §12-4-104(b) statutory factors for the application, a motion was
