SUBJECT: Travel & Tourism Board Interviews and Appointment

STATEMENT/PURPOSE

Pursuant to the Agreement Establishing the Jackson Hole Travel and Tourism Joint Power Board, the Board of County Commissioners and Jackson Town Council shall appoint seven (7) voting members to the Jackson Hole Travel and Tourism Board. A majority of board membership shall be comprised of representatives of the travel and tourism industry.

BACKGROUND/ALTERNATIVES

The Travel and Tourism Joint Power Board was established in 2011 with the primary function of allocating Teton County's portion of the lodging tax. The Board's focus has expanded since and now includes visitor education and destination stewardship.

There is currently one open seat on the board with a term expiration of June 30, 2026. This seat was the result of a resignation in August of 2025. There are 9 applicants for this vacancy.

The Jackson Hole Travel & Tourism Board is responsible for strategically allocating lodging tax toward initiatives that benefit the broader community ensuring tourism is a positive force for people, nature, and the economy. My understanding is that the Jackson Hole Travel & Tourism Board serves as a joint powers board representing both the Town of Jackson and Teton County, with responsibility for stewarding visitor-generated lodging tax revenues. These funds are unique in that they are paid primarily by visitors, many of whom may never directly experience the long-term outcomes of those investments, yet they have lasting impacts on the community. Because of this dynamic, serving on the Board carries a meaningful public responsibility and requires thoughtful, balanced decision-making that considers both visitor and resident perspectives.

I understand the Board's role to be primarily strategic rather than operational, helping set overall direction and priorities for how tourism supports the destination, approving funding allocations and budgets, and providing oversight and guidance to the Executive Director and organization. Decisions made at the Board level influence not only visitor experience, but also the lived experience of community members and the long-term vitality of Jackson Hole from community, economic, and environmental perspectives.

As a joint powers board working with public resources, collaboration, transparency, and consideration of multiple perspectives are important aspects of the role. Lodging tax investments support marketing, events, and initiatives that enhance both visitor experience and the community, and I see the Board's responsibility as ensuring those investments are made thoughtfully and with a long-term view.

With the organization's transition toward a Destination

Management and Marketing Organization (DMMO), I understand the Board's role continuing to evolve toward long-range planning and destination stewardship, thinking not just about today's tourism economy, but about what Jackson Hole should look and feel like 10 or more years from now. To me, success means ensuring tourism remains a positive contributor to both the local economy and the character and sustainability of the community.

Why do you want to serve on this Board?

I want to serve on this Board because Jackson Hole is home, and sustaining what makes this community special is deeply personal to me. I grew up here, and returning to live and work in this town was incredibly important to me. At the same time, I recognize that I was able to come back in part because of tourism, which plays an essential role in the local economy and in creating opportunities for people like me to build a life here. Because of that, I believe tourism is both inherently important to Jackson and something that must be stewarded thoughtfully, never at the expense of the community, environment, or character that make this place unique.

Applying for this position felt like an opportunity to combine my interest in strategic thinking with something I genuinely care about. When I chose to return home, I wanted to contribute in a way that was meaningful to the town rather than doing work I could do anywhere. Serving on this Board feels like a natural extension of that goal and an opportunity to become more deeply engaged in helping shape the future of the community.

I believe I bring a perspective shaped by both lived experience and professional insight. As someone who

grew up here and intends to live here long term, the future vitality of Jackson Hole is personal because it is my future as well. I also recognize that working within the tourism industry can create perceived divides, and I see value in helping bridge perspectives between community and industry conversations. I believe those viewpoints are not mutually exclusive and that thoughtful collaboration is essential to moving forward.

I also bring the perspective of a younger generation that will help guide Jackson into the future, along with a strong interest in systems thinking and strategy that focuses on how to thoughtfully use and enhance what already exists rather than simply pursuing growth for its own sake. Additionally, my background as a CPA provides a practical foundation in financial understanding and accountability, which I believe is important when stewarding public funds.

What motivates me most is preserving the authenticity and character that define Jackson Hole, including the connection to nature and wildlife, the sense of community, and the qualities that make both residents and visitors feel that this place is real and special. My hope is that tourism continues to support the town while protecting the very things that make people want to be here in the first place.

What are your qualifications for serving on this Board?

My qualifications come from a combination of personal commitment to the Jackson Hole community, experience thinking strategically, and practical skills that align with the responsibilities of the Board.

Having grown up in Jackson and planning to live here

long term, I bring an understanding of the community perspective and a strong personal investment in the town's future. Because my future is tied to this place, I naturally think about decisions in terms of balance and sustainability and how choices made today will shape Jackson Hole years from now.

I am particularly interested in strategy that focuses on thoughtful stewardship rather than simply increasing volume. In my professional experience, I have seen the value of working with the people and resources already here, engaging the right partners, and making the most of existing assets and opportunities. I believe long term success comes from ensuring visitors have authentic, high quality experiences that they want to share with others, creating strong word of mouth reputation and sustainable visitation over time rather than short term growth alone.

While I have experience working around tourism, I see that perspective as just one part of understanding the broader community. I value balancing economic opportunity with community character and environmental stewardship, and I am comfortable considering multiple viewpoints when navigating complex discussions.

Additionally, my background as a CPA provides experience in financial analysis, budgeting, and accountability, which I believe is important when stewarding public lodging tax funds and evaluating funding decisions.

Overall, I hope to bring a balanced, community focused perspective along with strategic thinking and

financial understanding to support thoughtful, long term decision making for Jackson Hole.

What experience and/or special training do you have that is pertinent to this Board's efforts?

My most relevant experience comes from financial training, practical familiarity with the Board's funding process, and professional experience working collaboratively within the Jackson Hole community.

As a CPA, I have formal training in financial analysis, budgeting, and accountability. This background provides a strong foundation for reviewing funding requests and understanding the responsibility involved in stewarding public lodging tax funds.

Through my work in events, I have applied for funding from the Travel and Tourism Board and have become familiar with the application process, evaluation criteria, and the importance of alignment with Strategic Destination Management Plans. This experience has given me a practical understanding of how funding decisions connect to broader community and destination goals. I also understand the importance of transparency and recusal where appropriate when prior involvement exists.

In my professional role working in marketing and events, I focus on creating experiences that encourage visitors to have meaningful connections to Jackson Hole and share those experiences with others. This has given me practical insight into the value of word of mouth reputation and how positive visitor experiences contribute to sustainable visitation over time rather than relying solely on increased volume.

I have also worked within an organization during a period of significant growth and transition, which

required adaptability, collaboration, and strategic thinking as priorities and systems evolved. With the Travel and Tourism Board entering a period of organizational evolution through the transition toward a DMMO, I understand the importance of flexibility, clear direction, and thoughtful planning during times of change.

My work also requires collaboration with local partners, organizations, and stakeholders, which has strengthened my ability to listen, coordinate across perspectives, and think strategically about how existing assets and opportunities can be used effectively.

Together, these experiences have prepared me to contribute thoughtfully to discussions involving funding decisions, long term planning, and the responsible stewardship of tourism resources in Jackson Hole.

What is your understanding of the time and service requirements of this Board and how are you prepared to meet them?	My understanding is that Board service includes regular monthly public meetings, as well as additional work sessions or special meetings as needed, and committee work when applicable. I also understand that the real time commitment goes well beyond the meetings themselves. To serve effectively, you have to come prepared. That means reading materials in advance, doing your research, digging into funding requests and budgets, and thinking strategically about long term direction and impacts. The preparation and follow through outside of official meeting time is a major part of doing the job well. I also recognize that there are times when the commitment increases, especially during funding

cycles, strategic planning periods, or organizational transitions. With the organization entering an important phase of evolution toward a DMMO, I understand that the time and level of engagement may be higher than the baseline expectations.

I am prepared to meet those requirements by prioritizing this service intentionally and making consistent space for both meeting attendance and the work that happens in between. My current role requires strong time management and a high level of preparation, and I am comfortable dedicating the time needed to be thoughtful, informed, and accountable in this role.

Purpose & Policy Considerations.

The purpose of this item is for the Mayor and Council to consider appointments to the Public Art Task Force ("PAT").

Recommendations.

Staff recommends the Council consider appointing two members to the Public Art Task Force.

Background.

The Public Art Guidelines state that the PAT may be comprised of up to seven (7) volunteer members appointed by the Mayor. The Mayor appoints members with the advice and consent of the rest of Council in making these appointments.

The current members of the PAT are Charlie Hagan, Stephanie Wright, John Stricklin, Tammi Hanawalt, and Susan Scarlata. Two members stopped serving on the PAT in late 2025. Staff advertised and received 4 letters of interest for the vacant seats.

Members are appointed by a majority of Council to serve three-year terms. There are currently two vacant seats which will expire on April 30, 2029.

Analysis & Key Questions.

Members should reflect a diverse cross section of the visual arts field. Duties of the PAT are:

- *Establish and approve parameters for each new public art project including artist selection process and selection criteria, project budget and a list of prospective Selection Panel members.*
- *Appoint a member of the PAT to serve as a member on selection panel appointed by the Committee.*
- *As needed, request that the Town Design Review Committee review proposals for artwork that may have architectural or urban design implications and make recommendations and comments to the PAT.*
- *Review all capital improvement projects under consideration by the Town of Jackson with the Public Art Coordinator and identify which projects are suitable for inclusion in the Annual Public Art Plan based on the guidelines listed in Section 4. These recommendations will be presented to the Town Council in a public workshop.*
- *Make an annual recommendation for maintenance of the Public Art Collection.*
- *Advise new Federal and State building projects outside the jurisdiction of the Town on the Public Art Program and how to work with the program.*
- *Reference its guide and policies for commissioning artwork.*
- *Participate in an annual review of the Public Art Coordinator.*

Public art challenges us to reconsider what art is and where it belongs. I would bet that if you asked a group of people well versed in art from a multitude of perspectives, you would receive a wide range of answers that are fundamentally different. The art that goes into most museums is obvious, from paintings hung meticulously by their movement to ancient tapestries displayed across massive walls that challenge the way you previously imagined those who came before us to be capable of creating.

Conversely, public art has a way of catching you off guard. It can be anything from a statue in the middle of a roundabout to a ring of starburst leaves carefully selected to temporarily highlight the base of a particularly large tree. More importantly, the cause for placing these art installations is usually apparent if you're curious enough to take a closer look. A wildlife bronze statue may subtly increase safety and reduce vehicle collisions while seeming to simply serve tribute to a locally beloved animal. A yellow ring of leaves surrounding the base of an institutional pine may be serving to draw public attention for conservation of an important community space. Therefore, public art is often utilized for public good in a way that serves everyone that passes through the space.

Public art is also more fluid than the type that lives within the walls of museums. It is meant to live amongst us in our everyday spaces, in our daily comings and goings - from catching a glimpse of a mural on our way to an important meeting to being surprised by carefully set impressions within the concrete that our heels click against as we head to a first date. While my experiences with interacting with these spaces may be significantly different than that of someone else, the conclusive aspect of public art is that we all interact within it, on top of it, and through it.

I believe that if I were offered the chance to join the Public Art Task Force, I would be able to bring a valuable professional perspective that includes organizational and industry-specific skills from my planning background with Jorgensen Associates, Inc. over the last four years of working in planning and development in the Town of Jackson and Teton County.
